## Split to host Croatia-Serbia quarterfinal

The ITF announced that the Croatian Tennis Association has selected the Spaladium Arena in Split for the historic first meeting between Croatia and Serbia in the quarterfinals of the 2010 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas on 9-11 July.

Three of the four quarterfinal venues have now been confirmed, with Chile returning to Enjoy Tennis Center in Coquimbo for its quarterfinal against Czech Republic, and the Olympic Stadium in Moscow hosting the tie between Russia and Argentina. France has been granted an extension until 6 April to confirm the venue for its quarterfinal against defending champion Spain.

Split's Spaladium Arena, which was only opened in 2009, will provide seating for 10,000 spectators for the clash between 2005 champion Croatia and Serbia, which only scored its first ever World Group victory in March when it defeated USA in Belgrade. The surface for the tie has still to be confirmed.

Enjoy Tennis Center in Coquimbo was the venue for Chile's emotional first round victory over Israel, just a week after the country was hit by earthquakes. ## AGMs support principles of Davis Cup and Fed Cup

The Annual General Meetings of Tennis Europe and the Asian Tennis Federation took place last week in Riga, Latvia and Guangzhou, China respectively. At the invitation of both Regional Associations, ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti and Executive Vice President Juan Margets made presentations about the Role of the ITF in Professional Tennis. The AGMs were told that the ITF Board of Directors at its recent meeting in Munich had defined four principles as intrinsic to the future of Davis Cup and Fed Cup:









- 1) Played on an annual basis
- 2) Home-and-away format
- 3) In association with National Associations
- 4) Conforming to the Rules of Tennis

The Board also confirmed its standpoint that the ITF was always open for consultation about suggestions to improve either competition, as long as these four principles were upheld.

Following the presentations, a motion was raised and unanimously agreed by the nations that comprise Tennis Europe and the Asian Tennis Federation to support these four principles for Davis Cup and Fed Cup for the future as well as confirm their support for the ITF Board of Directors.

"This confirmation of the support of two of our major Regional Associations for the principles that define Davis Cup and Fed Cup is an indication of how positive they feel about the future of our two international team competitions," said ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti. "The ITF is an organisation of nations and it is important that our members feel that we are going in the right direction for our major competitions. Let me extend my thanks to both Tennis Europe and the Asian Tennis Federation for their vote of confidence."

## Seniors World Championships begin in Mexico

The 2010 ITF Seniors World Team Championships get underway in Mexico City today, with 143 teams from 26 countries.

In the 35 age category, France returns as defending champion in the women's Suzanne Lenglen Cup, although Spain, led by current world No. 1 Ana Salas Lozano, will be looking to reclaim the title it won in 2007 and 2008. The Spanish are among the favourites in the men's Italia Cup, led by former top 100 player Oscar Martinez.

The Americans will once again field some strong teams, with some of the most distinguished players in the competition. Five-time Grand Slam doubles winner Rick Leach leads the US Dubler Cup (Men's 45) team, while former top professional Gretchen Magers will aim to win a second consecutive Margaret Court Cup (Women's 45).

USA also attempts to retain its Maureen Connolly Cup (Women's 55) and Fred Perry Cup (Men's 50) titles, as well as reclaim the Maria Esther Bueno Cup (Women's 50) crown it won three years running before Great Britain ended its streak in Mallorca last year.

France remains a strong contender, with former top 100 player Rodolphe Gilbert looking to add a team trophy to last year's individual title in the Tony Trabert Cup (Men's 40), while the men will also feel confident going into the Dubler Cup (Men's 45) and Austria Cup (Men's 55). The French will also look for success in the Young Cup (Women's 40) in which champion Italy will not return for a third consecutive title attempt.

Italy will however present a strong challenge to France in the Tony Trabert Cup, where it is defending champion, and the Dubler Cup, where the team includes two of last year's Tony Trabert Cup winners. Meanwhile Australia, led by 2008 World Champion Andrew Rae, bids to defend the Austria Cup (Men's 55), having won the title for five successive years.

The Opening Ceremony took place on Sunday at Club Deportivo Chapultepec, with all 143 teams in attendance. The Mexicans put on a spectacular display, which included local music and a dance show by the Ballet Folklórico Nacional de Mexico, and finished with a fireworks display.

## Beach Tennis World Championships return to Rome

The second ITF Beach Tennis Tour World Championships will again take place at the historic Foro Italico in Rome on 2-4 May. The event, being played alongside the traditional Sony Ericsson WTA Tour event, is the most important tournament on the 2010 ITF Beach Tennis Tour, offering maximum ranking points for men's and women's doubles.

Italy's 2009 men's world champions Riccardo De Filippi and Marco Ludovici, and women's world champions Simona Briganti and Rosa Stefanelli, will return to defend their titles, but can expect some very stiff competition, not only from their Italian rivals, but also teams from Spain, Germany, Japan and Brazil, who will be eager to show off their range of skills in the Italians' backyard.

With acceptance for the tournament based on the current rankings, a number of wild cards will be available to international teams who are yet to establish themselves on the ITF Beach Tennis World Rankings. ## Riga hosts Tennis Europe AGM

Tennis Europe's 36th Annual General Meeting was held in Riga, Latvia on 25-28 March, hosted for the first time by the Latvian Tennis Union.

Delegates from 36 of Tennis Europe's 49 member nations attended the event, where updates were given on the organisation's key constitutional and operative matters, alongside presentations from external speakers and the ITF.

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti and Executive Vice President Juan Margets also engaged in a question-and-answer session with delegates. Following the session, the representatives of all nations present took the opportunity to express their unanimous support for the motion recommended by Tennis Europe's President, Jacques Dupre, that the Davis and Fed Cup competitions continue to be based on the key principles outlined by the ITF.

The AGM was also the location of Tennis Europe's annual awards presentations, with the European Tennis Trophy prizes being given to representatives from Russia (Overall Performance, Junior Tennis), Germany (Seniors Tennis), Netherlands (Wheelchair Tennis) and Spain (Professional Tennis) during Saturday's plenary session.

Seven Tennis Europe Awards, which are given as recognition of outstanding contribution to the sport following recommendations from member nations, were presented to Harutyun Pambukyan (Armenia), George Krumov (Bulgaria), Guram Tokhadze (Georgia), Lothar Schrogel (Germany), Tommy Hindley (Great Britain), Iurie Drozd (Moldova) and Sergey Leoniouk (Russia).

Dupre said: "This has been a very good meeting, and I'd like to express my gratitude to all of the delegates and speakers for attending, and also for their contributions during the weekend. We have had a busy and productive programme, and we passed several key motions. The high level of interaction during both sessions was particularly pleasing."

## Players warm up for African Junior Championships

Africa's leading juniors will prepare for the 2010 ITF/CAT African Junior Championships by taking part in this week's International Junior Championships of Nigeria in Abuja. The tournament, which offers competition in three age categories, 18, 16 and 14-and-under, has attracted entries from 102 boys and 93 girls from 40 nations.

The ITF Grade 2 18-and-under events give players the opportunity to gain valuable ranking points in what will be a very competitive week, with both the boys' and girls' main draws fielding a strong entry. Players qualified for the 16 and 14-and-under age categories by taking part in one of three zonal championships which took place in January in West and Central Africa, Southern Africa and East Africa.

The International Junior Championships of Nigeria allow the African players to adapt to local conditions in preparation for the all-important African Junior Championships, held at the same venue next week. Feed-in consolation events are organised so that players have the opportunity to play a singles match every day, giving the players vital competition in advance of their continent's most prestigious junior tennis event.

## Success for China and Korea at Asian Junior Championships

Chinese and Korean players dominated Group 1 of the ITF/ATF 14-and-under Asian Championships, held on 14-27 March at the Yuetong Sport Tennis Club in Shenzhen, China. The event was hosted by the Chinese Tennis Association (CTA) for the first time in conjunction with the Asian Tennis Federation (ATF).

These championships attracted the best players from China, Hong Kong China, India, Indonesia, Korea, Philippines and Thailand, alongside two ITF teams comprising juniors from the rest of Asia who qualified from the Group 2, 3 and 4 events held earlier in the year.

The championships began with a two-day training camp, followed by two consecutive tournaments using a feed in consolation system. Points were awarded for each tournament to determine which players qualified for the Asian ITF Team that will travel to Europe for six weeks this summer.

Xin Chen (CHN) and Geon Ju Shin (KOR) won the two boys' singles titles, while Chinese duo Qiuyu Ye and Yihong Li were the two girls' champions. Shin and compatriot Hyeon Chung (KOR) won both boys' doubles titles, while the Chinese pairings of Yihong Li and Yan Wang, and Ruyu Yan and Qiuyu Yewere the two girls' doubles winners.

Suresh Menon, ITF Development Officer for Asia, said: "This event brings the best 14-and-under under players in Asia together in one location. Many of today's top Asian juniors have participated in this competition and have gone on to become among the top juniors in the world. It acts as a stepping stone for the Asian players to make their mark in the international tennis arena." ## IC Junior Challenge Finals to take place in Delhi

The World Finals of the second IC 16-and-under Junior Challenge will take place on 13-19 December 2010 at the Delhi Lawn Tennis Association centre in India. The event, which has been rescheduled from its original dates in April, will be staged by The International Lawn Tennis Club of India, with assistance from AITA.

These World Finals are the culmination of International Clubs (IC) Junior Challenges held on each continent over two years, with the five winning countries and European runners-up competing to be the best IC team in the world. The holders New Zealand will be joined by Brazil, Germany, Great Britain, India and USA in the six-team line-up, with 23 countries having taken part in Junior Challenges.

Competitors will be also helping to run a clinic for children from an orphanage in the region, as part of the IC's strategy of providing tennis opportunities to underprivileged children all over the world.
