Line-up confirmed for World Group Play-offs

The line-up for the 2010 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Play-offs is confirmed after Australia, Brazil, Italy, Kazakhstan, Romania and South Africa all won their Zone Group I second round ties last weekend.

The Draw for the Play-offs will take place on Tuesday 11 May at the ITF offices in London at 10:30 (09:30 GMT).

The eight seeded nations are Australia, Ecuador, Germany, India, Israel, Sweden, Switzerland and USA. Seeds are based on the new ITF Davis Cup Nations Ranking of 10 May.

Each of the seeds will be drawn against one of the following unseeded nations: Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Colombia, Italy, Kazakhstan, Romania and South Africa.

The 2010 World Group Play-offs will take place alongside the World Group semifinals on 17-19 September. The eight winning nations will contest the 2011 World Group.

Swedish success at Invacare World Team Cup

Sweden won its second men's title in three years at the 2010 Invacare World Team Cup in Antalya, Turkey. Netherlands retained both the junior and women's titles, while USA regained the quad title.

Third seed Sweden overcame defending champion France in the men's semifinals in a deciding doubles rubber, before upsetting top seed Netherlands 2-1 in the final. The Dutch had won all their singles rubbers en route to the final, and Robin Ammerlaan went on to defeat Peter Wikstrom 46 75 62 to give them an early lead. However Stefan Olsson beat world No. 3 Maikel Scheffers 57 62 62, before partnering Wikstrom to a 76(2) 63 win over Scheffers and Ronald Vink 76(2) 63, sparking great scenes of celebration with teammates Niclas Rodhborn and Dan Wallin and coach Toni Gustavsson.


In the women's event, defending champion Netherlands secured an astonishing 23rd title without dropping a rubber. Their final opponents Japan had upset Great Britain 2-1 in the semifinals, with 16-year-old Yui Kamiji the star of the team. In the final Kamiji came within two points of taking the first set against world No. 7 Jiske Griffioen in the opening rubber, but Griffioen held on for a 75 61 victory. Aniek van Koot, who was leading the Dutch team for the first time, then wrapped up Netherlands's triumph with a 61 62 win over Yui Kamiji.

Men's World Group 2 proved to be a great success for nations that have benefitted from the development work of the ITF Silver Fund, with Colombia, Iran and Sri Lanka joining second seeds Argentina in the semifinals. Colombia went on to win the title with Mauricio Vega and Elicier Oquendo securing a 2-0 win over Argentina in only their third year in the competition.

In the quad event, USA and Israel emerged from the same round-robin group to contest the final, where USA repeated its victory in the group stages. World No. 2 David Wagner defeated Shraga Weinberg 62 75 to give USA a winning 2-0 lead and secure its sixth quad title.

World No. 1 junior Tom Egberink led Netherlands to a third successive junior title, but with Netherlands and Spain locked at 1-1 after the two singles rubbers in the final, Spain was forced to default after their No. 2 player Roberto Chamizo fell ill before the deciding doubles rubber.

With the Invacare World Team Cup completed, 38 coaches from 18 nations remain in Antalya over the next two days for the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Coaches Workshop.

Surprise winners at Beach Tennis World Championships

Italy achieved a clean sweep at the 2010 ITF Beach Tennis World Championships that ended on 4 May at the historic Foro Italico in Rome. However new champions were crowned in both the men's and women's events, with No. 4 seeds Alan Maldini and Luca Meliconi winning the men's doubles, and No. 8 seeds Federica Bacchetta and Giulia Spazzoli emerging as women's doubles champions. Maldini went on to partner Elena Vianello to victory in the mixed doubles exhibition event.

The three-day tournament, held alongside the traditional Sony Ericsson WTA tour event, featured 57 teams representing 17 nations in the men's and women's doubles, an increase of nine teams and three nations on last year's tournament.

In the men's event, Maldini and Meliconi did not drop a set in their five matches, seeing off the unseeded pairing of Massimiliano Corzani and Luigi Mazzarone (ITA) 64 62 in the final. In the women's event Bacchetta and Spazzoli upset top seeds Laura Olivieri and Simona Briganti (ITA) in the semifinals, before overcoming Giorgia Gadoni and Rosa Stefanelli (ITA) 36 63 61 in the final. The winners received their champions trophies from ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti.

WADA approves new protocols for doping control process

The World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) Executive Committee has approved protocols to further foster cooperation between anti-doping organisations in the doping control process in its meeting at Montreal.

Article 15.1 of the Code gives responsibility for testing at international sporting events to the international organisation that is the ruling body for the event (eg the International Olympic Committee for Olympic Games), while National Anti-Doping Organisations are responsible for testing at national events. However, the article does provide that anti-doping organisations can request permission to test at an event where they are not the ruling body.

In order to encourage effective cooperation between these various anti-doping organisations, the Executive Committee approved a standardised protocol through which an anti-doping organisation can request permission to test.

"We are confident that this protocol will provide the anti-doping community with an additional tool to ensure effective in-competition anti-doping programmes," said WADA's Director General David Howman. "As the independent organisation responsible for monitoring the global fight against doping in sport, WADA constantly strives to foster cooperation between its stakeholders."

Australia wins World Junior Tennis qualifier

The Asia/Oceania final qualifying boys' event for World Junior Tennis was staged in Anqing City, China last week. Sixteen teams contested four spots in the Finals, to be held in Prostějov, Czech Republic in August. Top seeds Australia defeated fourth seeds China to take first place, with both teams qualifying for the World Junior Tennis Finals alongside losing semifinalists Japan and Korea.

Action continues in China this week with the girls' qualifying event, with 15 teams contesting the four available spots at the Finals in August. The South American qualifying event for the World Junior Tennis Finals also takes place this week. Ten nations will compete in Bauru, Brazil, looking for the three girls' and three boys' spots at the Finals in Prostějov.
