Former champions look to regain titles

The 2010 Roland Garros Championships got underway on Sunday. As Roger Federer and Svetlana Kuznetsova bid to defend their titles, Rafael Nadal and Justine Henin start their campaigns to reclaim the tournament they have both won four times.

Four-time champion Nadal, whose only loss on the Paris clay in five appearances was to Robin Soderling in last year's fourth round, has retained his favourite status in the men's draw after winning in Monte Carlo, Rome and Madrid to post a 15-0 record on clay so far in 2010. The Spaniard is bidding to become just the second man in history, after Bjorn Borg, to collect five Roland Garros singles titles. Borg won six in total.

Nadal plays his first round match on Tuesday, while world No. 1 Federer has gone through to the second round. At stake for the world No. 1 is not only the possibility of beating arch rival Nadal to claim his second successive Roland Garros crown, but also a 17th Grand Slam title. If he maintains his No. 1 ranking, Federer will also equal Pete Sampras's record of 286 weeks at the top on the Monday after the tournament ends.

Kuznetsova is already safely through to the second round of the women's draw and will be hoping to become the first woman since Henin in 2007 to defend her title. Henin, who won her titles in Paris in 2003 and 2005-07, is the only woman to win Roland Garros more than once in the last decade and, although her return from retirement was motivated by the desire to win Wimbledon, another victory in Paris would be a major boost following her runner-up finish at the Australian Open. Henin won her first title since her comeback on clay in Stuttgart at the beginning of the month.

Other contenders in a women's field that looks more open than the men's are Serena and Venus Williams, Caroline Wozniacki, Samantha Stosur, Flavia Penetta and Francesca Schiavone.

Birykuov and Capra sublime at Italian Open

An American lifted the girls' singles trophy at the Italian Open for the second year running, as Beatrice Capra clinched her first Grade A title in Milan, one year after compatriot Sloane Stephens's feat.

Eighth seed Capra, trained by Federico Ricci at the Evert Tennis Academy, produced a masterpiece in the final to beat her roommate and No. 10 seed Lauren Davis, 61 64. Capra took advantage of her greater experience on the ITF Junior Circuit and used her aggressive ground strokes and powerful serve to help her to victory.

"I'm very happy to have won in Milan," said Capra, who also triumphed at the Grade 1 Banana Bowl in March. "At the end of the second set I was just a bit nervous and Lauren benefited from my tiredness. Now I will celebrate this important victory with all my relatives. I want to play the same way at Roland Garros."

Unseeded Mikhail Biryukov became the first Russian to win the Italian Open since Yevgeny Kafelnikov in 1992. Biryukov forced his way past four seeds without dropping a set, then overcame fifth seed Jiri Vesely in the final when the Czech had to retire while trailing 64 30.

In front of a large crowd on Centre Court, hard-hitting Biryukov started the match strongly before Vesely fell victim to a stomach problem at 4-4 in the first set and required medical treatment. The Russian won the first set 64 and was 3-0 ahead in the second when Vesely was unable to continue.

"I'm really sorry for Vesely but there were high temperatures today," said Biryukov. "I'm excited to feel a part of the Bonfiglio history. My purpose is to become soon a World No.1 following in the footsteps of my fellow Russian Yevgeny Kafelnikov."

Fifth seeds Duilio Beretta (PER) and Ricardo Quiroz (ECU) claimed the boys' doubles trophy over the fourth seeded German duo of Peter Heller and Kevin Krawietz 76(4) 57 10-7. Sixth seeds Nastja Kolar (SLO) and Chantal Skamlova (SVK) posted a 63 63 win over fourth seeds Yana Buchina (RUS) and Anna-Lena Friedsam GER to win the girls' doubles title.

South American junior qualifying complete

The South American qualifying event for the 2010 Junior Davis & Fed Cup by BNP Paribas was staged in Asuncion, Paraguay last week, with ten boys and ten girls teams contesting the three boys and three girls places at the Finals in San Luis Potosi, Mexico. Bolivia won the girls event to qualify for the Finals and will be joined by runner-up Argentina and third-placed Paraguay. Chile won the boys event and will be joined in the finals by runner-up Brazil and third-placed Argentina.

Qualification for the 2010 junior team finals has now been completed on all continents except Europe, where the European Summer Cups will serve as qualifying events. The finals of the boys Copa del Sol and girls Europa Cup, to be held on 2-4 July, will determine the remaining five boys and girls teams to qualify for the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov. The finals of the boys Borotra Cup and girls Helvetie Cup, which take place on 2-4 August, will determine the remaining six boys and girls teams to qualify for Junior Davis & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas in September. Asuncion hosts COSAT AGM

The 2010 Confederation of South American Tennis (COSAT) AGM was held in Asuncion, Paraguay on 21-22 May alongside the South American qualifying event for the 2010 Junior Davis & Fed Cup by BNP Paribas. The Presidents of ten federations in the region attended, as well as ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti.

The AGM approved the report of the 2009 financial activities, and unanimously agreed a new Board of Directors, with Camilo Perez-Lopez, the President of the Paraguayan Tennis Association, being the only new member. It was unanimously decided that election of a new COSAT President would be postponed until the 2011 AGM, and in the meantime a commission will be formed to review the COSAT constitution which will be adopted before that election.

Following a presentation by Ricci Bitti about the Role of the ITF in Professional Tennis, a motion was raised and unanimously agreed by the COSAT nations to support the four principles for Davis Cup and Fed Cup that had been defined by the ITF Board of Directors and previously supported by the Tennis Europe, Asian Tennis Federation and Confederation of African Tennis AGMs: played on an annual basis; home-and-away format; in association with National Associations; and conforming to the Rules of Tennis.

Morea named AAT Honorary Life President

The Argentinian Tennis Association (AAT) last week named its former President Enrique Morea as the first Honorary Life President in the history of the organisation. Morea was AAT President in 1973-1979 and 1997-2009. He is a former member of the ITF Board of Directors and has been an Honorary Life Counsellor of the ITF since 1993.

The AAT also named Hector Romani in the newly-created role of Executive Vice President.

Obituary - J. Randolph Gregson

Former USTA President J. Randolph (Randy) Gregson passed away on 24 May in New Orleans.

Gregson was USTA President in 1985-86, and served on the ITF Board of Directors in 1987-89. He was an ITF Honorary Life Counsellor.
