Croatia and Serbia in historic clash

Croatia and Serbia will face each other in Davis Cup by BNP Paribas this weekend for the first time since becoming independent nations. Ivan Ljubicic, who led Croatia to the 2005 title, returns to the team that hosts Serbia on an indoor hard court at the Spaladium Arena in Split. A total of four quarterfinal ties and 19 Zone Group I and II ties will be held on 9-11 July, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website: www.daviscup.com.

Serbia, which is currently enjoying its best Davis Cup run, having never previously reached the quarterfinals, brings a full strength squad to face Croatia. World No. 2 Novak Djokovic. Viktor Troicki, Janko Tipsarevic and doubles specialist Nenad Zimonjic will face tough opposition in Ljubicic, Marin Cilic, Ivan Dodig and Antonio Veic for a place in the last four.

France and Spain have both been dealt injury blows ahead of their tie on an indoor hard court in Clermont-Ferrand. The hosts have lost their No. 1 Jo-Wilfried Tsonga to a knee injury, while Wimbledon champion Rafael Nadal has opted out of representing Spain as he bids to overcome a recurring knee injury. Fortunately both nations have considerable strength in depth, and with the likes of David Ferrer, Fernando Verdasco, Gilles Simon and Gael Monfils all named in the squads, it looks like being a closely contested encounter.

Nikolay Davydenko will lead Russia in its quest for a fourth semifinal berth in five years at home against Argentina, which brings a depleted squad to Moscow. With Juan Martin del Potro still recovering from wrist surgery, the South Americans are relying on Davis Cup stalwart David Nalbandian to spearhead a young team comprising Horacio Zeballos, Eduardo Schwank and Leonardo Mayer to help them through to the semifinals.

San Diego to host Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Final

San Diego has been selected by the USTA to host the 2010 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Final between USA and Italy, taking place on 6-7 November. The Final will be played on an indoor hardcourt at San Diego Sports Arena, which has a capacity of nearly 9,000. The Final will be a repeat of last year's title decider, when Italy was crowned champion for the second time after defeating USA 4-0 in Reggio Calabria. This time the Americans will be hoping to make home advantage count.

"We are very excited that San Diego will be hosting the 2010 Fed Cup Final," said Mary Joe Fernandez, who has now led USA to the Final in both of her first two years as captain. "The area always has been supportive of women's tennis. We look forward to playing in front of a large, enthusiastic, and patriotic crowd and hope to use the home-court advantage as we try to bring the Fed Cup title back to the US."

Italy booked its place in the Final with wins over Ukraine and Czech Republic, while USA battled past two former champions, France and Russia. The semifinal victory over Russia was sealed in the deciding doubles rubber. The last Fed Cup tie held in the San Diego area was in 2008, when USA defeated Germany in the quarterfinals. With Wimbledon runner-up Tomas Berdych joining Radek Stepanek on the sidelines due to a stomach injury, it will be an unfamiliar Czech team of Jan Hajek, Ivo Minar, Lukas Dlouhy and Frantisek Cermak that travels to Coquimbo to face Chile. In the absence of Fernando Gonzalez with a knee injury, Chile is relying on Olympic gold medallist Nicolas Massu, Jorge Aguilar, Paul Capdeville and Cristobal Saavedra-Corvalan to secure its progression through to the last four.

The four quarterfinal winners will compete in the World Group semifinals on 19-21 September. In the semifinals, Croatia would be away to Chile or home against Czech Republic, while Serbia would be away to Chile or Czech Republic. France would be at home against Russia or Argentina, while Spain would be at home to Argentina but away to Russia.

Nominations for all ties can be found on the Davis Cup website, where you can also view up-to-date results, plus live scoring, news, photographs and audio interviews from the World Group quarterfinals. The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 8 July**.

Wimbledon glory for Nadal and Williams

Rafael Nadal and Serena Williams both produced dominant displays to win the Wimbledon singles titles last weekend. Nadal overcame surprise Czech finalist Tomas Berdych 63 75 64 to win his second men's title, while Williams won her fourth women's crown with a 63 62 victory over Russian Vera Zvonareva, who also had an unexpected run to the final.

Second seed Nadal, who was unable to defend his title last year through injury, extended his unbeaten run at The All England Club to 14 matches. After twice being taken to five sets in the opening week, he grew in confidence during the tournament, dropping only one set in his final three contests.

"Every one is really special," said Nadal, comparing this victory to his 2008 triumph. "It's difficult to say this one is more special. The other one was more dramatic, the way to win. So first title is always very, very special."

There were no such problems for top seed Serena Williams, who successfully defended her women's title without dropping a set, firing a Wimbledon record 89 aces during the event. The American now holds 13 Grand Slam titles which moves her up to sixth in the all-time Grand Slam winners list behind Margaret Court, Steffi Graf, Helen Willis Moody, Martina Navratilova and Chris Evert.

Williams said: "It means a lot because it is 13. So it's kind of cool because I was able to pass Billie [Jean King]. That's always nice. I don't know where it rates, to have four Wimbledons is really, really exciting."

Unseeded Jurgen Melzer (AUT) and Philipp Petzschner (GER) defeated No. 16 seeds Robert Lindstedt (SWE) and Horia Tecau (ROU) 61 75 75 to clinch the men's doubles title, while Vania King (USA) and Yaroslava Shvedova (KAZ) overcame Russians Elena Vesnina and Zvonareva 76(6) 62 to take the women's title.

In the mixed doubles final, Leander Paes and Cara Black defeated Wesley Moodie and Lisa Raymond 64 76(5).

Fucsovics and Pliskova win Wimbledon junior titles

Marton Fucsovics made history at the 2010 Wimbledon Junior Championships becoming the first Hungarian to win the boys' singles title. Fucsovics, the No. 13 seed, progressed through the draw without dropping a set, but survived tough matches with the No. 8 seed James Duckworth (AUS) in the quarterfinals and Facundo Arguello (ARG) in the semifinals.

In the final he faced unseeded Benjamin Mitchell from Australia, who was bidding to become the first ever qualifier to win the boys' title. In front of a large crowd on Court No. 1, Fucsovics came from a break down in the first set to clinch the title 64 64. "Last year I won the US Open in doubles so that was also the first for the Hungarian tennis, now this is the second," said the 18-year-old.

In the girl's draw, No. 9 seed Kristyna Pliskova of the Czech Republic was crowned champion after overcoming Sachie Ishizu of Japan in a close fought final 63 46 64. Pliskova defeated British wildcard Eleanor Dean in the last 16 before winning a mammoth quarterfinal with American Sloane Stephens 46 61 97.

"I'm in London for the first time and I really enjoy it," said Pliskova, whose twin sister Karolina claimed the girls' title at this year's Australian Open. "I appreciated to play here. I think it's the best of these four."

A large crowd watched the first ever all British boys doubles final with wildcard pairing Liam Broady and Tom Farquharson defeating George Morgan and Lewis Burton 76(4) 64 on Court No. 1.

There was more success for Hungary in the girls' doubles after Timea Babos combined forces with Stephens, to claim their second Grand Slam title in a month. The duo defeated Irina Krochameva (RUS) and Elina Svitolina (UKR) 67 (7) 62 62.

Dutch enjoy Wimbledon wheelchair success

Dutchman Robin Ammerlaan won his third Wimbledon men's wheelchair tennis doubles title in four years on Sunday when he partnered Sweden's Stefan Olsson to victory over Australian Open and Roland Garros champions Stephane Houdet (FRA) and Shingo Kunieda (JPN).

Houdet and Kunieda were unable to capitalise on 3-1 leads in both sets allowing Ammerlaan and Olsson to fight back and edge to a 64 76(4) victory. Ammerlaan and Olsson also recovered from 4-0 down in their semifinal against Dutch duo Maikel Scheffers and Ronald Vink to prevail 76(5) 62, while Houdet and Kunieda eased past Frenchmen Frederic Cattaneo and Nicolas Peifer in their semifinal 63 62.

Dutch dominance continued in the women's doubles where top seeds Esther Vergeer and Sharon Walraven eased to a 62 63 victory over Australia's Daniela di Toro and Britain's Lucy Shuker. This was Vergeer's second successive Wimbledon's women's doubles title after she won the inaugural event in 2009 with compatriot Korie Homan.

Scheffers and Vink gained third place in the men's doubles after defeating Cattaneo and Peifer 61 64. Annick Sevenans and Aniek van Koot ended their Wimbledon debuts with a 63 67(2) 64 victory over Florence Alix-Gravellier and Jiske Griffioen in the third place play-off in the women's doubles.

Success for ITF/Grand Slam 18 & under touring team

Diulio Beretta (PER) and Roberto Quiroz (ECU) were the stars of the ITF/Grand Slam International 18 & Under Junior touring team that completed its tour of Europe at the weekend. Beretta and Quiroz captured the Roland Garros boys' doubles title as the team enjoyed considerable success overall on the eight-week tour.

Following an intensive training week in Pisa, Italy, the 13 players representing 13 countries took part in a series of Grade A and Grade 1 tournaments on clay and grass, including the prestigious Grand Slam junior tournaments at Roland Garros and Wimbledon.

The opening tournament in Santa Croce saw Romania's Cristina Dinu reach the girls' final, while Bosnian Damir Dzumhur reached the boys' semifinals. Dzumhur went on to reach another semifinal in Milan, where Beretta and Quiroz won the boys' doubles title. Play then moved to Charleroi, Belgium, where Paraguay's Veronica Cepede Roig reached the girls' semifinals and partnered Dinu to the doubles title.

The highlight of the junior clay court season is Roland Garros, where Beretta reached the boys' semifinals, before partnering Quiroz to a 63 62 doubles final victory over Facundo Arguello and Agustin Velotti (ARG). The ITF team dominated the final clay court event in Offenbach, where they were involved in all four titles. Dinu and Dzumhur won the singles events, Dinu and Cepede Roig captured the girls' doubles, and Ireland's John Morrissey shared the boys' doubles title.

The team found the grass court events more challenging, although Cepede Roig reached the semifinals of the Wimbledon warm-up event at Roehampton. Dzumhur went on to reach the quarterfinals at junior Wimbledon, with Dinu and Cepede Roig progressing to the girls' doubles semifinals.

The team is financed by the Grand Slam Development Fund, providing players not only with the opportunity to take part in top level international competition but as a team under the guidance of ITF coaches. Ivan Molina (COL), Frank Zlesak (CZE), Roberta Burzagli (BRA) and Philipp Born (GER) accompanied the 2010 team.

South Americans star in 16 & under touring team

Members of the ITF/Grand Slam 16 & under touring team dominated their five-week tour to Europe, winning 17 titles and reaching a further 15 finals.

South American players captured eight tournament titles thanks to Bolivian twin sisters Maria Ines and Maria Paula Deheza, who won one singles and three doubles titles between them. The Argentinean duo of Mateo Nicolas Martinez and Juan Ignacio Galarza secured the Le Pontet and Milan doubles titles, with Martinez also winning the singles event at Le Pontet.

European team members also had a successful tour, bringing back seven titles. Irina Bara of Bulgaria won a trio of tournaments, at Crema, Le Pontet and Paris Cadets, while Sergis Kyrtziz of Cyprus also won at Crema.

The Asian and African teams produced some significant results, with Amer Naow (SYR) and Arjun Kadhe (IND), and Aldila Sutjiadi (INA) and Garanok Tiraganok (THA) capturing the boys' and girls' doubles titles at Paris Cadets. Ronit Bisht of India reached the boys singles final at Avenire, and Valeria Bhunu (ZIM) and Vladica Babic (MNE) won the girls doubles at the same tournament.

Chris Pillai, the Asian team coach, said: "It was a great opportunity to all of our players to compete in Europe simply because they get a huge experience playing with different types of players. Most of the Asian kids play only in Asia and they don't come out to Europe. This opportunity gave them a chance to check their standard and also to get to play on clay court, a surface not too familiar to us."

European teams qualify for World Junior Tennis Finals

Last weekend's final round of the 14 & under European Summer Cups determined the European qualifiers for the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov, Czech Republic, on 2-7 August. The boys' Copa del Sol and the girls' Europa Cup act as the final qualifying round for Europe, with five nations in both the boys' and girls' events joining the Czech Republic, which automatically qualifies as host of the Finals.

The Europa Cup for girls took place in Loano, Italy, where Russia defended its title with a win over France. The three other girls teams to qualify were Ukraine, Spain and Austria.

In the boys' competition, France successfully defended its Copa del Sol title with a 3-0 win over Poland in Magaluf, Spain. Great Britain, Russia and Italy also booked their ticket for the Finals.

The European qualifying events (Borotra and Helvetie Cup) for the 16 & under Junior Davis Cup/Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals will take place on 2-4 August. For further information and results from the qualifying events, visit www.tenniseurope.org.
