France ends Spain's Davis Cup run

France stunned defending champion Spain 5-0 in its quarterfinal tie in Clermont-Ferrand to reach the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group semifinals for the first time since 2004.

Despite the absence of French No. 1 Jo-Wilfried Tsonga through injury, Guy Forget's squad dominated the four-time Davis Cup champions, led by No. 10 Fernando Verdasco and No. 12 David Ferrer, and will now host Argentina in September's semifinal. The South American nation advanced thanks to another courageous performance by David Nalbandian, who clinched a 3-2 victory for Argentina in the decisive fifth rubber against Russia in Moscow.

The semifinals will be played alongside the World Group play-offs on 17-19 September, with venues to be confirmed by 21 July.

All four members of France's team contributed a point over the weekend in front of a sell-out crowd at the Grande Halle d'Auvergne. Gael Monfils staved a fightback from Ferrer in the opening rubber to pull through 76(3) 62 46 57 64, and Michael Llodra used his singles and doubles expertise to win two points for France, defeating Verdasco 67(5) 64 63 76(2) in Friday's second match before teaming up with Julien Benneteau to seal France's unassailable victory over Verdasco and Feliciano Lopez in the doubles.

It marked France's first victory over Spain in Davis Cup since 1923 and also just the second time since the formation of the World Group in 1981 that a defending champion has suffered a 5-0 defeat.

"It's as good as it can get, great crowd, great matches," said Forget. "It's been a few years since we were in the semifinals but we have a young group of players who have improved every year and I think now is their time."

Nalbandian firmly cemented his place on the Argentine Davis Cup squad after defeating both world No. 6 Nikolay Davydenko and No. 14 Mikhail Youzhny in straight sets. It was the second tie in a row that the No. 153, still recovering from an injury lay-off, clinched the decisive fifth rubber for Argentina, having done so against Sweden in the first round in Stockholm. It meant Russia's first home defeat since 1996, but Argentina must make another bit of history and beat France for the first time in Davis Cup if it is to reach the final.

Serbia proved too strong for Croatia in its emotionally-charged tie in Split, where world No. 2 Novak Djokovic won both his singles rubbers in straight sets over Ivan Ljubicic and then Marin Cilic to secure Serbia's place in the semifinals. The visitors were the only team to field both a Top 10 singles and Top 10 doubles player in the quarterfinals, with doubles No. 1 Nenad Zimonjic partnering Janko Tipsarevic to victory on Saturday.

"It means the world to every one of us," said Djokovic, who even received appreciation from the Croatian fans for his performance over the weekend. "Personally, I had a lot of responsibility with the package that I carried on my back before this tie, but right now I feel so relieved. We won in one of the toughest atmospheres against a team that has a lot of success in this competition."

Serbia's opponent in the semifinals will be Czech Republic, who proved its strength in depth by defeating Chile without its star duo of Tomas Berdych and Radek Stepanek. Jan Hajek and Ivo Minar stepped up for the occasion and defeated Nicolas Massu and Paul Capdeville in straight sets, before world doubles No. 5 Lukas Dlouhy had his chance to shine alongside Hajek, confirming the Czechs' place in the last four by overcoming Jorge Aguilar and Massu 76(3) 63 36 63 in Saturday's doubles.

The Czechs will be on the road for the third time this year, but Czech captain Jaroslav Navratil believes nothing is impossible. "Without our top two we managed to beat Massu in Chile which is a perfect result, and with Tomas and Radek hopefully back on the team in September, I think we have a good chance still to beat Serbia in Serbia." Hall of Fame welcomes Class of 2010

Seven tennis greats had their names etched into the sport's history books on Saturday, as the Class of 2010 were inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame at a ceremony in Newport, Rhode Island.

Todd Woodbridge and Mark Woodforde – or the Woodies, as they're affectionately known – were among the inductees, following careers that have seen them amass 61 doubles titles together, a tour record that has only just been equalled by Bob and Mike Bryan. The Woodies teamed up to lift 11 Grand Slam trophies, including five in a row at Wimbledon between 1993 and 1997.

"This is an amazing day for the Woodies," said Woodforde. "I don't know if any of us said 'we're just going to be doubles players'. We just excelled on the doubles court a little more than we did on the singles. As much as we would have loved to win more singles titles, we did in doubles."

Gigi Fernandez and Natasha Zvereva were also inducted after their domination of women's doubles. The pair combined to win 38 titles together, of which 14 came at Grand Slam events, and in the early 1990s they won six consecutive major titles.

Owen Davidson entered the Hall of Fame in the Master Player category, largely for his exploits on the mixed doubles court. He is one of only 13 players to win a calendar year Grand Slam, having picked up all four major mixed titles in 1967.

Derek Hardwick, who was a past President of the ITF, Chairman of the LTA, and was instrumental in the game's transition to the Open Era, was recognised for his services to tennis in the Contributor category. He was inducted posthumously, having passed away in 1987.

Brad Parks, the pioneering founder of wheelchair tennis, was also recognised in the Contributor category. He is the inaugural inductee from wheelchair tennis, which is now played in more than 100 countries.

Brad Parks inducted into Hall of Fame

Brad Parks, the pioneering founder of wheelchair tennis, became the first wheelchair player to be inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport, Rhode Island on Saturday. Parks, 53, was elected in the Contributory category alongside Derek Hardwick

The ITF's Wheelchair Tennis Manager Mark Bullock joined Park's family and friends for the official induction ceremony on Bill Talbert Centre Court at the Hall of Fame.

After being injured in a skiing accident, Parks began experimenting with hitting tennis balls from a wheelchair while he was in rehabilitation and in 1976 wheelchair tennis was born. He founded the National Foundation of Wheelchair Tennis (NFWT) as the sport's organising body in USA and as more athletes became involved, the Wheelchair Tennis Players Association (WTPA) was formed.

Parks started the first international wheelchair tennis event, the US Open, and was the tournament chairman for 18 years. He was also the brainchild behind the inaugural World Team Cup in 1985 and today this prestigious event has been contested by 54 different nations in its 26-year history.

Parks is also credited with spreading the sport internationally by holding clinics throughout Europe, Asia and the Pacific. In 1988, the International Wheelchair Tennis Federation (IWTF) was formed, with Parks as the inaugural president. He served on the Management Committee for many years and was a driving force of international wheelchair tennis. In 1998, the IWTF was fully integrated into the International Tennis Federation, making it the first disabled sport to achieve such a union at international level.

US Open prize money tops record \$22.6 million

The 2010 US Open purse will top \$22.6 million, an increase of \$1 million from last year. In addition to the base purse of \$22.6 million, the top three men's and top three women's finishers in the Olympus US Open Series may earn up to an additional \$2.6 million in bonus prize money at the US Open, providing a potential total payout of \$25.2 million.

Both the men's and women's US Open singles champions will earn a record \$1.7 million with the ability to earn an additional \$1 million in bonus prize money, based on their performances in the Olympus US Open Series. This is a 6.7% increase in singles prize money over last year. For the 38th consecutive year the USTA will offer equal prize money to both men and women.

The Olympus US Open Series Bonus Challenge rewards the top three men's and top three women's finishers each year with bonus prize money at the US Open and has resulted in the largest paychecks in tennis history for men (2007 – Roger Federer, \$2.4 million) and women (2005 – Kim Clijsters, \$2.2 million).
