## Juniors prepare for Singapore Youth Olympics

Sixty-four of the world's leading juniors will take part in the first-ever Youth Olympic Tennis Event in Singapore, which gets underway this Sunday, 15 August, at the Kallang Tennis Centre. Thirty-eight countries are represented in the boys' and girls' events that both comprise 32 players in singles and 16 pairs in doubles.

The inaugural Youth Olympic Games, held on 14-26 August, will welcome around 5,000 athletes and officials from the 205 National Olympic Committees to Singapore. Young athletes – aged between 14 and 18 – will compete in 26 sports. The Youth Olympic Tennis Event, for players aged 18 & under, will take place on 15-21 August.

Three junior Grand Slam champions will contest the boys singles, headed by world No. 1 and Wimbledon junior champion Marton Fucsovics of Hungary. He is joined by two former junior No. 1-ranked players, India's Yuki Bhambri and Brazil's Tiago Fernandes, who won the Australian Open boys title in 2009 and 2010 respectively. A total of 25 nations will take part in the boys event, with world No. 3 Damir Dzumhur (BIH), No. 5 Duilio Beretta (PER) and No. 6 Jiri Vesely (CZE) also among the contenders for the title.

Roland Garros champion and former world No. 1 Elina Svitolina of Ukraine heads an impressive girls entry that also includes Paris runner-up Ons Jabeur of Tunisia and Wimbledon finalist Sachie Ishizu of Japan. Another former Roland Garros runner-up Daria Gavrilova teams up with Yulia Putintseva in a strong Russian line-up, while world No. 3 Monica Puig (PUR) and No. 4 Tímea Babos (HUN) are also among the entries from 24 competing nations. Stefanie Tan of Singapore will carry home hopes, having received a host nation place into the event.

Up to two boys and two girls per country are taking part in the singles and doubles events. Unlike the regular Olympic Games, players can partner someone from another country in the doubles. World ranking points are also available, with the Youth Olympic Games Tennis Event a Grade A event on the 2010 ITF Junior Circuit.










Japan's Ai Sugiyama, who contested four Olympic Games for her country, will represent tennis on site as an Athlete Role Model. The Athlete Role Models programme will be implemented by the Singapore Youth Olympic Games Organising Committee (SYOCOG) as part of the Culture and Education Programme.

ITF President and IOC member Francesco Ricci Bitti said: "With nearly 40 countries from seven regions, it is exciting to see tennis so well represented at the first Summer Youth Olympic Games. Performance and universality are two of the cornerstones of the Youth Olympics, and I am confident that the quality of entry and range of participants will contribute to a successful tennis event in Singapore."

The Opening Ceremony will be held on 14 August on the Marina Bay Floating Platform.

## Chile and USA win titles at World Junior Tennis Finals

The Chilean boys team and USA girls team triumphed in Saturday's finals of the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov, Czech Republic. Fifth seed Chile defeated third seed Italy 2-1 to lift the boys' trophy, while USA, the No. 1 seed, beat fifth seed Ukraine 2-1 to claim its fourth successive girls' title.

In the boys' final, Christian Garin got Chile off to a good start, defeating Filippo Baldi 62 76 in the opening match under the roof on centre court. Italy's Gianluigi Quinzi, the outstanding singles player of the week, then overcame Bastian Malla to finish the week unbeaten and take the tie into a deciding rubber. The Chilean pair of Malla and Garin went on to score a resounding 61 63 victory over the Italian pair to secure Chile's first World Junior title.

Russia defeated Great Britain 2-0 in the boys third-place play-off to claim the bronze medal.

In the girls' final, Ukraine's Viktoriya Lushkova maintained her unbeaten run in Prostějov by defeating Gabrielle Andrews 63 61 in the first singles rubber. Brooke Austin, a member of USA's winning team last year, restored American hopes by levelling the tie with a three-set victory over Oleksandra Korashvili. Andrews and Taylor Townsend then came out on top in the deciding doubles against Korashvili and Lushkova 63 16 61, to claim a record-breaking fourth successive title.

In the third-place play-off, Australia claimed the bronze medal with a 2-0 victory over third seed China, its best performance since losing in the final in 1992.

The ITF's 14-and-under international team competition saw a record total of 172 teams from 94 countries take part in 2010, with the top 16 boys and girls teams competing for the title in Prostějov. ## Serena heads early entries for 2011 Hyundai Hopman Cup

Organisers of the Hyundai Hopman Cup have announced several big-name entries for the 2011 event that will take place at the Burswood Dome in Perth on 1-8 January. World No. 1 Serena Williams will be accompanied by four other Grand Slam champions: Novak Djokovic, Ana Ivanovic, Lleyton Hewitt and Hopman Cup debutant Justine Henin.

Joining these champions is Frenchman Gael Monfils, who will team up with 2009 ITF World Junior Champion Kristina Mladenovic. Henin will be partnered by Steve Darcis, and Serena will pair up with John Isner. Hewitt's partner is still to be confirmed.

The ITF's official mixed team championship has engaged a new television partner in Ten Network. A daily session will feature on the network's acclaimed sports channel *One HD*, complemented by 20 hours of national coverage on the Ten Network.

"This is such an exciting time for the event," said Tournament Director, Paul McNamee. "We are delighted to partner up with the newest player in Australian tennis being the Ten Network, and our viewers will no doubt enjoy the fresh perspective of our telecast.

"And it's a spectacular line up. Some of the biggest and most celebrated names in the sport will play-off for the coveted diamond-encrusted trophies in January. Justine Henin will become the 22nd No. 1 player to participate and it is fantastic that Perth fans will get to see her in action." ## European teams complete Junior Davis/Fed Cup Finals line-up

The 16 & under European Summer Cups finished last week, confirming the remaining six boys and six girls teams who will go forward to the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals in San Luis Potosi, Mexico, from 28 September until 3 October.

France won the boys event for the fourth time in six years, beating Great Britain in the final. The other qualifiers were Czech Republic, Serbia, Russia and Latvia. It is the first time that a team from Serbia has qualified for the Finals of the Junior Davis Cup.

The girls event was won for the second consecutive year by reigning Junior Fed Cup champions Russia, who defeated Ukraine in the final. Joining them in the Finals will be Germany, Czech Republic, Belarus and France.

**Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas:** Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Czech Republic, France, Great Britain, India, Japan, Latvia, Mexico (host), Russia, Serbia, South Africa.

**Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas:** Argentina, Australia, Belarus, Bolivia, China, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Japan, Mexico (host), Paraguay, Russia, Tunisia, Ukraine, USA, Uzbekistan.

## Success for ITF 14 & under teams in Europe

Four ITF 14 & under teams, comprising 39 players from 25 countries, completed a successful five-week trip to Europe at the weekend, which saw them capture several titles on the ITF tour to Young Stars tournaments, part of the Tennis Europe 14 & under circuit.

The Tennis Europe team started well at the BNP Paribas event in Paris, with Ukraine's Viktoriya Lushkova winning the girls singles against teammate Damira Muminovic (BIH). Chileans Christian Garin and Bastian Malla of the COSAT team won the boys doubles, while there was a girls doubles victory for China's Yihong Li and Qiuyu Ye of the ATF team against CAT team players Ilze Hattingh (RSA) and Mayar Sherif (EGY).

Garin and Malla scored their second doubles victory at the Windmill Cup in Leeuwarden, while Lushkova partnered teammate Jelena Ostapenko (LAT) to the girls doubles titles. The third week saw the teams move on to Rueil-Malmaison, where Praewpisuti Chinsakchai (THA), an ATF team player, shared the girls doubles title with Mami Adachi (JPN).

Tennis Europe players dominated the girls events at the fourth event in Cologne, with Lushkova taking her second singles title and partnering Ostapenko to another doubles triumph. Malla added the boys singles trophy to his previous two doubles titles. The last tournament took place in Hasselt, Belgium, where three of the teams secured titles. COSAT team player Silas Cerqueira (BRA) captured the boys singles title before winning the doubles event with teammate Pedro Lamachkine (PER). The combined ATF/CAT team of Chinsakchai and Sherif lifted the girls doubles trophy.

The junior touring teams are part of the ITF Development Programme, which is financed by the ITF and the Grand Slam Development Fund. The teams provide a unique opportunity for players from South America, Central America & Caribbean, Africa, and parts of Europe and Asia to gain experience and compare their skills against the best European players.

## South Africa dominates 18 & Under Circuit

South Africa dominated this year's ITF South/Central Africa 18 & Under Circuit, capturing three of the four singles titles. Six countries from the South and Central African region took part in the two-week circuit, which consisted of two ITF Grade 4 junior events in Windhoek, Namibia. These events provided players from the region with an opportunity to earn ITF Junior Ranking points and gauge their level against each other and an overseas entry.

Overall South Africa won six of the eight titles on offer. Natasha Fourouclas (RSA) clinched both girls' singles titles, defeating compatriots Adri Lochner 61 60 in the first event and Tracy Plant 64 67 62 in the second. Both girls' doubles finals were all-South African affairs, with Dane Joubert and Madrie Le Roux proving too strong for Lochner and Clorinda Wessels 64 61 in the first, and Fourouclas and Plant 75 61 in the second.

In the first boys' singles final, South Africa's Marc Van Der Merwe defeated compatriot Warren Kuhn 76 36 61, while Burundi's Hassan Ndayishimiye won the second title over Kuhn 75 61. Ndayishimiye and Tendai Tapfuma (ZIM), both of whom attend the ITF/SATA Training Centre in Pretoria, won the first boys doubles event, while the second title went to Kuhn and compatriot Dylan Comerford.

## Clean sweep for host Bulgaria

Host nation Bulgaria captured all the titles at the ITF/Tennis Europe 12 & Under Development Championships at Dema Tennis Club in Sofia on 4-7 August. The club also hosted the seventh ITF/Tennis Europe South East Regional Training Camp, which took place over the preceding five days.

The development championships were played in a multiple round-robin format. The top six boys and four girls from the qualifying rounds played against each other in order to determine the winner.

Kaloyan Valchev lifted the boys title after winning all five matches in the final round-robin. Viktorija Bardarova also won all three of her final matches to run out a convincing girls winner. Valchev then teamed up with Nikola Georgiev to become boys doubles champion, with Bardarova and Petia Arshinkova winning the girls doubles title.

Earlier 34 players and nine coaches from the Balkan and Caucasus region took part in the training camp under the supervision of the ITF/Tennis Europe expert Rolf Buhler (SUI).

Buhler said: "The training camp was equally beneficial to players and coaches. For coaches, it was a good occasion to share ideas on tactical and technical issues, while for the players, it created an opportunity to practise and compete with players from different backgrounds and of varying playing levels."
