Super-Seniors World Team Championships underway in Turkey

The ITF Super-Seniors World Team Championships got underway today on the clay courts at Ali Bey Club Manavgat in Antalya, Turkey with 134 teams from 27 countries competing in nine age categories for the titles in the men's and women's 60 to 75 as well as the men's 80 cups. They will play three days of round-robin competition, followed by a knock-out stage to determine the final standings.

Australia is the defending champion in five age categories, after its success on home soil in Perth last year, and will have a strong chance of retaining the Alice Marble Cup. Last year's winners Kerry Ballard and Carol Campling are joined by Wendy Gilchrist, who is new to the age category, and have been named as the top seeds in the youngest women's Super-Senior cup.

USA will be looking to improve on the two cups it won in 2009. It is favourite again for the Bitsy Grant Cup, returning with John Powless and King van Nostrand from last year's triumphant team, and is the top seed in the Britannia Cup, its other title in 2009, with Jimmy Parker as top player in the team. It has also been seeded first in the Althea Gibson and the Queens' Cup on the women's side. The Gardnar Mulloy Cup looks set for a close battle between USA and Canada after the successful Canadian duo of Lorne Main and Ken Sinclair moved up to the oldest team age category this year.

The British hopes are focused on the Kitty Godfree Cup. Champions on grass in Perth, Britain returns with Sue Hill, Jenny Waggot and Jackie Boothman as well as Frances Maclennan, who was not present last year. Its biggest rivals will be a German team led by Heide Orth.

Jorge Camina Borda will lead Spain as it attempts the triple in the Von Cramm Cup after consecutive victories in 2008 and in 2009, while Peter Pokorny will spearhead the Austrian challenge in the Jack Crawford Cup. Record prize pool at 2011 Australian Open

Tennis Australia has announced that the 2011 Australian Open will offer the biggest prize pool in the history of the event. The total prize pool will be A\$25 million, with the men's and women's champions taking home \$2.2 million each

The 2011 event will celebrate the history and heritage of the event and its players, dedicating a special lead-up day to kids, with ongoing plans to encourage even greater community engagement in the lead-up and during the tournament.

The first stage of the redevelopment of Melbourne Park has already begun. Victorian Minister for Sport James Merlino said: "Work has begun on our Government's \$363 million redevelopment of Melbourne Park which will ensure the precinct remains the home of tennis for generations to come."

During the launch for the 2011 event, outgoing Tennis Australia President Geoff Pollard said farewell to the audience and introduced his successor, New South Wales lawyer Steven Healy who will take over the role at the end of the month. For further information, visit www.tennis.com.au.

Devvarman and Rodionova claim Commonwealth gold

The inaugural Commonwealth Games tennis event at the RK Khanna Tennis Complex in Delhi drew to a close over the weekend, with India's Somdev Devvarman and Australia's Anastasia Rodionova winning the singles gold medals.

Devvarman delighted the Indian crowd by defeating Greg Jones (AUS) 64 62 in the men's final on Sunday. Devvarman was in fine form throughout the week and eased to the title without dropping a set.

"A gold medal is tough to come by," said the 25 year-old. "I'm happy I got mine. I've worked really hard. Right now, I'm really happy."

Devvarman teamed up with Rohan Bopanna in the men's doubles, but missed out on a bronze medal after losing to fellow Indians Mahesh Bhupathi and Leander Paes 63 76(4). Top seeds Bhupathi and Paes were knocked out in the semifinals by Australians Paul Hanley and Peter Luczak. The Aussie duo went on to triumph 64 36 63 over England's Ross Hutchins and Ken Skupski in the final.

Rodionova ended Sania Mirza's hopes of clinching a gold medal on home soil, winning 63 26 76(3) in a compelling contest between the top two seeds.

"It's great to be part of the Australian team," said Rodionova. "It's the first gold medal in tennis [at the Commonwealth Games]. I'm happy to do Australia proud. It feels like it's one of the biggest achievements of my career."

Rodionova, partnering Sally Peers, went on to collect her second gold medal in the women's doubles, winning 63 26 63 against compatriots Jessica Moore and Olivia Rogowska in the final. The world No. 62 was unable to capture the treble, though, being forced to settle for silver with Hanley in the mixed doubles. The No. 1 seeds suffered a shock 76(7) 67(2) 62 defeat in the final at the hands of Scotland's Jocelyn Rae and Colin Fleming.

"We've exceeded expectations to win a gold medal," said Fleming. "We knew we had a good team and that all the players were capable of coming home with a medal. I couldn't be happier that it's us. The fact it's gold is unreal. I'm still in shock."

Clean sweep for Uzbekistan in Kyrgyzstan

Uzbekistan captured all the eight titles at the ITF 13 & under Asian Championships which came to a close at the weekend in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

Jurabek Karimov justified his first seeding position by winning both the boys' singles and doubles events, defeating compatriot Khumoyunhon Sultanov in both singles finals. Karimov then teamed up with Sanetulla Kutibaev to beat the Uzbek pairing of Sultanov and Sharobiddin Abzalov in the first tournament and Vladimir Gnizozubov and Abduvali Abdurakhmanov from Kazakhstan in the second week.

The girls events saw Uzbek players Arina Folts and Yana Khon in both singles finals, with Folts victorious both times. Laylo Kim and Sarvinoz Saidkhodjaeva took the doubles title the first week, beating Folts and Khon, who exacted their revenge by defeating their opponents in the reverse finals match in the second week.

The central Asian circuit event, hosted by the Kyrgyzstan Tennis Federation after an absence of seven years, was attended by a total of 48 players from six countries in the region. A one-day training camp preceded two consecutive tournaments, which were staged using a feed-in consolation system in which leads to a final overall ranking. This point ranking determines who will qualify for the ITF team to participate in the next development circuit with other Asian tennis nations as part of the ITF's "pyramid of opportunity".

Moldovan President and Bubka promote 'Tennis 10s'

The Tennis 10s campaign has recently received the backing of two prominent figures in Eastern Europe: the honourable President Mihai Ghimpu of Moldova, and Olympic legend Sergey Bubka, President of the Ukraine National Olympic Committee.

Moldova celebrated a festival of different age-group tournaments, with President Ghimpu handing out the awards to the players and joining the players in Tennis 10s activities.

Bubka opened and took part in a Tennis 10s exhibition in Kiev as part of Ukraine's 'Create Olympic History' event. Organisers closed the main street in the Ukrainian capital, marked out smaller courts, and then invited children to take part using slower balls and smaller rackets. Bubka included a welcome message from the President of Ukraine in his opening address, before playing tennis with some of the children.

Both Moldova and Ukraine have been active in providing slower ball and smaller court competition to children aged 10 and under. The Rules of Tennis will change from 2012 so that all 10 and under competition worldwide cannot be played with a traditional, yellow ball. Instead a slower red, orange or green ball must be used with the appropriate sized court.

Dave Miley, ITF Executive Director of Development, said: "We congratulate both the Moldovan and Ukrainian Tennis Federations for the work in promoting slower balls and smaller courts with young children. Having the participation of President Ghimpu and Sergey Bubka is not only fantastic for their respective nations; but helps to promote Tennis 10s around the world." Vandierendonck to receive Brad Parks Award

The ITF has announced that three-time ITF Wheelchair Tennis World Champion Chantal Vandierendonck will be the recipient of the 2010 Brad Parks Award. The Award is granted every year to a person or organisation that has contributed to the international growth of Wheelchair Tennis.

A talented national tennis player before being injured in a car accident in 1983, Vandierendonck quickly took up the sport and, as a teenager, played in one of the earliest international tournaments in Europe, which was held in France in 1983. She went on to promote the sport not only in her own country, but in many others around the world and was instrumental in encouraging more women to play.

Vandierendonck was to become the first in a long line of top-ranked Dutch women in the sport. She was world No. 1 for many years and became the first ITF World Champion in the women's game in 1991 before becoming World Champion twice more, in 1996 and 1997. She also played in the first World Team Cup in 1985 against male opposition and was one of two Dutch players to secure the first of 23 World Team Cup titles for the Netherlands when the women's event was introduced in 1986.

Vandierendonck won the women's singles gold medal at the 1988 Seoul Paralympic Games, when wheelchair tennis was a demonstration sport, and went on to win two women's doubles gold medals and a women's singles silver and bronze medal at the 1992 and 1996 Paralympics after wheelchair tennis was awarded full medal status. In 1996, she also became NEC Wheelchair Tennis Masters champion. Vandierendonck will be presented with the Brad Parks Award next month.
