Italy begins title defence

The 2010 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas competition gets underway this week in 11 countries. World Group and World Group II first round ties take place on 6-7 February, and four Zonal Group events are also being contested this week.

Italy begins its campaign with a tricky away tie against Ukraine. Captain Corrado Barazzutti has named the same team - led by Flavia Pennetta and Francesca Schiavone - that defeated USA in last year's final.

Serbia will be making its debut in the World Group when it welcomes Russia, the four-time champion, to Belgrade. Jelena Jankovic and Ana Ivanovic have both been nominated in the side.

Federer and Williams crowned champions Down Under

Roger Federer and Serena Williams clinched the Australian Open singles titles in Melbourne over the weekend.

Federer, who stretched his record number of Grand Slam wins to 16, defeated Andy Murray 63 64 76(11) in the final. The world No. 1 came through an epic third set tiebreak, clinching victory with his third championship point.

Williams successfully retained her title but was made to work hard, beating wild card Justine Henin 64 36 62 in the final. Henin was playing in her first Grand Slam event since coming back from retirement. Williams, who collected her 12th Grand Slam singles title, also teamed up with her elder sister, Venus, to claim the doubles crown, the pair defeating Cara Black and Liezel Huber 64 63.

Bob and Mike Bryan won the Australian Open men's doubles title for the fourth time, defeating rivals Daniel Nestor and Nenad Zimonjic 63 67(5) 63. Cara Black and Leander Paes lifted the mixed doubles trophy, defeating Ekatarina Makarova and Jaroslav Levinsky 75 63. Reports on the Australian Open Junior and Wheelchair events follow overleaf.

Fernandes and Pliskova clinch junior titles in Melbourne

Tiago Fernandes of Brazil and Karolina Pliskova of Czech Republic were crowned Australian Open Junior Champions after both players enjoyed straight sets wins in Rod Laver Arena on Saturday.

Fernandes's opponent in the final was American wild card Sean Berman, who had reached the last two for the loss of just one set. It was Berman who started better, breaking in the first game, before Fernandes broke back in game four and again in game 11 to take the first set 75. The Brazilian then held his nerve in the second set, winning 63 to claim his maiden Grand Slam title.

Pliskova entered the tournament on the strength of her WTA Tour ranking of No. 222, but was an unknown quantity in the junior game. Her opponent in the final was Britain's Laura Robson, the girls' singles champion at Wimbledon in 2008. Robson defeated Pliskova's twin sister, Kristyna, in the semifinals.

Pliskova started the final stronger, dominating the first set 61 and taking an early break in the second. Robson fought back to level and forced a tiebreak, but the comeback did not continue, and she double faulted twice in an error-strewn end to the match.

Dutch pair Justin Eleveld and Jannick Lupescu were crowned boys' doubles champions, with a 64 64 win over Kevin Krawietz and Dominik Schulz. The girls' doubles title was won by the Slovakian team of Jana Cepelova and Chantal Skamlova, who beat top seeds Timea Babos and Gabriela Dabrowski 76(1) 62.

Homan wins first Grand Slam title

The first Grand Slam event of the 2010 NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour proved successful for the top seeds, with Korie Homan (NED), Shingo Kunieda (JPN) and Peter Norfolk (GBR) taking the Australian Open wheelchair titles.

World No. 2 Homan started the women's singles as a warm favourite, but was taken to three sets in her first two matches against Daniela di Toro (AUS) and fellow Dutchwoman Aniek van Koot. But in the final the 23-year-old produced a commanding performance to beat world No. 3 Florence Gravelier 62 62 and win her first Grand Slam title.

Kunieda and Stephane Houdet both came through their opening two singles matches in the men's draw relatively unscathed to set up a final between the world's two best players. When Houdet held two match points in the decider, world No. 1 Kunieda faced his first defeat since November 2007, but he managed to save both and go on to win 76(2) 26 75. The Japanese player collected his fourth Australian Open title and extended his winning streak to 78 singles matches.

Norfolk clinched his fourth Australian Open quad singles title after two victories over world No. 2 David Wagner in three days. In the round robin, World No. 1 Norfolk won just 11 points in the second set against Wagner before prevailing in three, but in the final polished off the American in straight sets, 62 76(4).

In the doubles, second seeds Houdet and Kunieda combined on the same side of the net to win the men's final, beating Maikel Scheffers and Robin Ammerlaan, while Gravelier and van Koot upset second seeds di Toro and Lucy Shuker in the women's final. American top seeds Nick Taylor and Wagner retained the quad title.

New champions at Junior Masters

Argentina's Gustavo Fernandez and Japan's Yui Kamiji won their first titles at the Cruyff Foundation Wheelchair Tennis Junior Masters on Sunday.

Fernandez dropped just six games in his three round-robin pool matches to earn a place in his first Junior Masters final. Junior world No. 1 Tom Egberink (NED) was also undefeated in his round-robin matches to top his pool of four players.

Egberink was making his third successive appearance in the boys' final but had to be content with runners-up honours for the third year running. Sixteen-year-old Fernandez pulled off a stunning victory against the Dutch boy, winning the last five games of the first set and recovering from 3-1 down in the second to prevail 63 64.

Natalia Mayara (BRA) produced the stand-out result in the round-robin phase of the girls' singles as she beat world No. 3 Mackenzie Soldan (USA) 36 63 61 to earn a place in the final.

But after Shingo Kunieda's Australian Open victory on Saturday, girls' wheelchair world No. 2 Kamiji completed a great weekend for Japan, running off five straight games in the second set to defeat Mavara 61 61.

Egberink and Spain's Daniel Caverzaschi recorded a dramatic victory in the boys' doubles final, coming from a set down to beat Britain's Philip Cochrane and Fernandez 26 76(4) [10-8] after a champions tiebreak. Kamiji and Soldan beat Mayara and Turkey's Busra Un 61 75 in the girls' doubles.

Ghana reigns at ITF/CAT West & Central African Junior Championships

Hosts Ghana won the team trophy at the recent ITF/CAT West & Central African Junior Championships, thanks to victories by Elisabeth Kapari in the girls' 14 & under and Francis Akpese in the boys' 14 & under. Kapari defeated Sarah Adegoke (NGR) 63 60 in their final, and Akpese overcame Emmanuel Idoko (NGR) 60 60.

Nine countries were represented in the week-long competition which took place in Winneba Sports College in Ghana. Nigeria finished in second place after Idoko's performance in the boys' 14 & under, with Umaru Balami also taking silver in the boys' 16 & under, losing the final to Tunde Segodo of Benin. Segodo's gold medal helped Benin finish in third place.

The girls' 16 & under competition was dominated by Sarah Haidara from Cote d'Ivoire who beat Catina Gamo from Cameroon after a tough match 64 16 61.

The top six players in each age group plus one ITF/CAT wildcard will qualify for the 33rd ITF/CAT African Junior Championships (AJC) to be held 4-8 April in Abuja, Nigeria.

Mr Amartey, President of the Ghana Tennis Association, said: "On behalf of the GTA I would like to thank the ITF, CAT, the Ministry of Sports & Youth, The Ghana Sports Council, the sports college of Winneba and our partners - UBI Petroleum, SIC Insurance, SSNIT, TV Africa and all the participants for the success of this event which will be the start of many developing projects for Ghana and neighbouring countries. Good luck for the winners in the AJC."

USTA creates US Open National Playoffs

The USTA has announced the launch of the US Open National Playoffs, providing the opportunity for all players aged 14 and older to earn a wild card for the US Open qualifying event in 2010.

“The US Open National Playoffs makes the US Open ‘open’, where one woman and one man will earn a wild card into the US Open Qualifying Tournament and a chance to advance to the main draw,” said Lucy Garvin, Chairman of the Board and President, USTA.

“The fact that the US Open National Playoffs are supported by qualifying tournaments run by our sections makes this event even more unique, extending the reach of the US Open across the country.”

Tennis raises nearly \$700,000 for Haiti

The tennis community has raised \$687,000 for the victims of the Haiti earthquake.

The Hit for Haiti event on the Sunday before the Australian Open raised \$140,000, and an auction of players’ rackets has raised more than \$44,000 so far.

The ITF, Grand Slam Committee, Sony Ericsson WTA and ATP World Tour have also made contributions to bring the total to \$687,000.
