## Belgrade to stage historic Davis Cup Final

Belgrade will stage the 2010 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Final between Serbia and France on 3-5 December.

Serbia reached the final for the first time in its 16-year history in the competition after coming from behind to defeat Czech Republic 3-2 in Belgrade. France reached its first final since 2002 after overpowering Argentina 5-0 in Lyon. The 2010 final will be played at the Belgrade Arena, which has already staged two of Serbia's ties in 2010, including last weekend's semifinal.

Austria, Belgium, Germany, India, Kazakhstan, Romania, Sweden and USA all scored wins in the World Group Play-offs to qualify for the 2011 World Group. The eight losing nations, Australia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, Israel, Italy, South Africa and Switzerland will all play in their respective Zone Group I events in 2011.

Serbia will bid to become only the 13th Davis Cup champion nation after a spectacular run to the 2010 final. The country only made its World Group debut in 2008, winning its first World Group tie earlier this year. Janko Tipsarevic was the hero of his country's victory over Czech Republic, sending the 17,000 spectators into a frenzy with his 60 76(6) 64 victory over Radek Stepanek in the deciding rubber.

With Novak Djokovic sidelined on the first day, Victor Troicki lost to Stepanek 46 62 64 64 in the opening rubber, before Tipsarevic levelled the tie with a 75 62 26 76(5) victory over Tomas Berdych. Djokovic and Nenad Zimonjic then suffered a 36 61 64 62 defeat by Berdych and Stepanek, before the Serb No. 1 set up the decisive rubber with a 46 63 62 64 triumph over Berdych.







Afterwards Tipsarevic paid tribute to the home supporters, saying: "Thank you, that's what we needed, you raised us from the dead." Djokovic added: "Whoever comes to Belgrade won't be the favourite."

There were no such problems for France, who became the first nation since Germany in 1993 to reach the final without conceding a live rubber. The hosts built up a 3-0 winning lead in two days, going on to complete their second whitewash victory of their 2010 campaign. France now looks for its first Davis Cup title since 2001, when it overcame Australia 3-2 in Melbourne.

For the second tie running, 30-year-old Michael Llodra was the toast of France, contributing two points to bring his total for the year to five victories. He gave the hosts an early lead with a 75 46 75 63 victory over Juan Monaco, before Gael Monfils overcame Argentina's 2010 hero, David Nalbandian, 64 26 64 63. Llodra and Arnaud Clement sealed France's place in the final with a comfortable 64 75 63 success over Eduardo Schwank and Horacio Zeballos.

In an exciting round of play-off ties, pride of place went to India, who fought off a 2-0 deficit to defeat Brazil 3-2 in Chennai. Leander Paes, competing for a 21st year, teamed up with Mahesh Bhupathi for a doubles victory, before Somdev Devvarman and Rohan Bopanna both scored singles wins on the final day.

Belgium was another team to come from behind to record a play-off victory, winning both singles rubbers on Monday to complete a 3-2 victory over Australia in Cairns after rain had washed out play on Sunday. Austria also won in the deciding rubber, with Martin Fischer defeating Harel Levy to secure a 3-2 triumph over Israel in Tel Aviv.

In the other play-off ties, Robin Soderling led Sweden to a 3-2 win over Italy in Lidkoping; USA overcame Colombia 3-1 in Bogota; while there were 5-0 victories for Germany over South Africa in Stuttgart, Kazakhstan over Switzerland in Astana, and Romania over Ecuador in Bucharest. Kazakhstan will now compete in the World Group for the first time.

## Junior success for Mauritius and Zimbabwe

Mauritius and Zimbabwe dominated the ITF/CAT 12 & under event which concluded last week in Harare, Zimbabwe. The circuit featured 18 boys and 8 girls from six countries: Botswana, Malawi, Mauritius, Namibia, Swaziland and Zimbabwe.

The circuit started with a two-day training camp and was followed by a 12 & under tournament, in which Dean Dulthummon (MRI) won the boys title, defeating fellow Mauritian Hemanshu Rambojun 76 (5) 46 62. Keren Muswere (ZIM) won both girls titles, defeating fellow Zimbabwean Karen Machisa 64 62 in the singles final, before partnering Machisa to victory in the doubles, winning all three round-robin matches without dropping a set.

Eligible players then went on to play in the Zimbabwe leg of the CAT 14 & under circuit and the remaining younger players from the 12 & under event joined other Zimbabwean players for a round-robin 10 & under tournament.
