Japan and Russia take top honours in Mexico

Japan and Russia are the 2010 Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas champions after they defeated Canada and China respectively in Sunday's finals in San Luis Potosi, Mexico.

Under cloudy skies Japan's Kazuma Kawachi faced Canada's No. 2 Edward Nguyen in the opening match on court one. Despite several breaks being exchanged, the opening set went to a tiebreak which Kawachi just edged. Nguyen failed to find his feet in the second set and the Japanese player soon stormed to victory 76 61.

Filip Peliwo stepped on to court one knowing he had to do the near impossible – beat Kaichi Uchida, who had been undefeated all week – if Canada were to have any chance to win. Peliwo lost his opening service game and found himself down 5-0 before he managed to get a game on the board. He broke early in the second to lead 3-1, but that was the best he could manage. Uchida upped his game, winning the next five games to win the second singles - and the Final- for Japan 62 63.

"We feel very happy and excited, it's the first time in Japanese tennis history that the under 16s are number one in the world," said Japanese captain Ko Iwamoto. "We knew if we can get one singles we are very confident in the doubles, and today our No. 2 singles player won his match so it meant there wasn't as much pressure on Kaichi."

It was a closer affair in the boys' bronze medal play-off with France and Great Britain needing a doubles rubber to separate them. Britain's Evan Hoyt, playing singles for the first time this week, overcame Gregoire Barrere 64 26 61 to put the Brits 1-0 up. France's Mathias Bourgue wasted little time in drawing his side level when he defeated Luke Bambridge in straight sets to set up a live doubles match, which France duly won 63 16 63.

Russia retained the girls' title for the second consecutive year after world No. 1 Daria Gavrilova and Margarita Gasparyan came through a tough encounter against Youth Olympic doubles and singles medallist, Saisai Zheng, and Ran Tian to claim victory.

Despite feeling under the weather, US Open junior champion Gavrilova defeated Haochen Tang in straight sets in her singles rubber to level the tie after compatriot Gasparyan had fallen to Tian in the opening match.

In front of a packed crowd, the Russian pair maintained their nation's winning streak in the competition, recording just one break in each set - enough to give them the victory.

Ukraine lived up to their seeding by taking third place in the girls' event, defeating USA 2-0 to take home the bronze medal.

Yemen success continues at ITF Asian Championships

Yemeni players dominated both boys and girls events at Group 4 of the ITF 13 & under Asian Championships which took place in Aleppo, Syria from 22 September to 2 October.

Forty-two players from 10 countries participated in the two four-day tournaments that followed a one-day training camp.

Yemen's Ghassan Alansi captured all the boys' titles winning both tournaments in singles and in doubles along with his compatriot Samer Thabet, who also did well in the singles finishing in third place in the first tournament. He then reached the final in the second week with an excellent win in the semifinals over Kareem Al Allaf, the No. 2 seed from Syria and runner-up of the previous tournament.

The Syrian pairing of Al Allaf and Mouhamed Azhari were the finalists of the first tournament in boys doubles and Yemen's Amer Abdo reached the second week's boys doubles final with Fahad Janahi (UAE).

Yemen's victories continued with Shaema Al Olfli lifting both girls singles trophies by winning all her matches of round robin groups. Elaheh Ashrafian from Iran also showed a consistent performance finishing 2nd and 3rd in singles. Anna Abu Al Haj (JOR) finished third in the first event then lost her place in the top three after losing in the round robin to Olla Mourad (QAT) who came in second position in the second tournament.

Al Haj and Mourad then teamed up to beat the Yemeni team of Al Olfli and Ayat Thabet but lost to the Al Ajeely sisters from Iraq in the second tournament.

The domination of the Yemeni players in the Championships highlighted the tremendous effort that the country is putting in towards the development of tennis especially as the Yemeni Federation relies almost completely on the ITF's provision of tennis equipment.

Based on the final rankings from the two events, players from West Asia will be selected to be on the ITF team that participates in Group 2 of the Asian Championships in January 2011.
