Rishika Sunkara with Hungarian partner Kapitany reached the **1st Rd**.

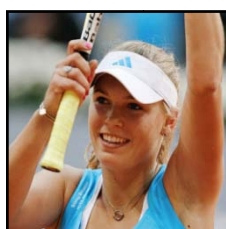

2010 ITF WORLD CHAMPIONS

The ITF has announced the names of the 2010 ITF World Champions. The ITF World Champions is based on an objective system that considers not only performances at the Grand Slams, Olympic Games and respective tours, but also gives weight to performances in the two ITF international team competitions, Davis Cup by BNP Paribas and Fed Cup by BNP Paribas.



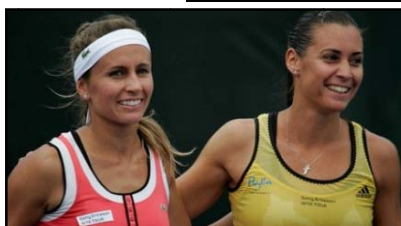
Men's & World Champion - Rafael Nadal (ESP) receives the title for the second time.

Women's World Champion - Caroline Wozniacki (DEN) became the fourth-youngest woman to earn the year-end No. 1 ranking. She is the first Danish player to receive the title.

Men's Doubles World Champions - Bob and Mike Bryan (USA) for a record seventh occasion.



Women's Doubles World Champions - Gisela Dulko (ARG) and Flavia Pennetta (ITA) becomes the Doubles World Champions for the first time.



Junior World Champions- Both Youth Olympic champions **Juan Sebastian Gomez (COL)** and **Daria Gavrilova (RUS)** receive the honours.

Wheelchair World Champions- **Esther Vergeer (NED)** becomes world champion for a remarkable 11th successive year while **Shingo Kunieda (JPN)** wins the award for the fourth running year.



The ITF World Champions will receive their awards at the annual ITF World Champions Dinner on Tuesday 31 May, in Paris, during Roland Garros.

AITA MEN'S TOURNAMENT

Prize money Rs. 4.0 L, AITA Men ranking tournament of was held at Kochi in the week of 24th January 2011.

S.V.Abhishek (5th seed) from A.P won his maiden men's singles title by beating Timothy Reynold in the straight sets 6-4, 6-3. On his way to the finals he beat Shahbaz Khan (2nd seed) 6-0, 6-1 in the QF and Adit Jain (4th seed) 6-3 6-0 in the semifinals. While, in the Doubles event Shahbaz Khan and Ajay Selvaraj won the title by beating Abhishek and Bharat Baradwaj 6-4, 3-6, 10-7.

NATIONALS VETERANS TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIP, CHENNAI

A J S Chhatwal (Delhi) won the Singles and Doubles events in the 55plus age category at the 2011 Nationals Veterans Tennis Championship held in Chennai in the week of 31st January 2011. He has won the Nationals Singles and Doubles titles 3 times (2009, 2010, and 2011) and 2 times (2010, 2011) in a row and was a runner up in 2009.

As per AITA ranking A J S Chhatwal is ranked No 1 in Singles and Doubles in 2010. Also as per ITF's Singles World of October 2010 he was ranked 100.
